Schedules for the Spring Shows 2010

EARLY SPRING (Reticulata) SHOW

Saturday, February 6th at Capel Manor Gardens, Bullsmoor Lane, Enfield, Middlesex EN1 4RQ

STAGING exhibits for the EARLY SPRING (Reticulata) SHOW may take place on Saturday, February 6th from 8am—10.30am.

ENTRIES to be notified to the Show Secretary by Wednesday, February 3rd.

Late entries at the Show Secretary's discretion.

LATE SPRING (Dwarf and Median) SHOW

Saturday, May 8th at Capel Manor Gardens, Bullsmoor Lane, Enfield, Middlesex EN1 4RQ

STAGING exhibits for the LATE SPRING (Dwarf and Median) SHOW may take place on Saturday, May 8th from 8am—11am.

ENTRIES to be notified to the Show Secretary by Wednesday, May 5th.

THE BRITISH IRIS SOCIETY SHOW RULES

British Iris Society members only may compete.

Unless otherwise stated, exhibitors are allowed up to three entries in each class.

Except in the Artistic Division, exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.

All exhibits must be ready for judging by the close of Staging times stated above. Exhibitors unable to attend may send their entries to the hall and they will be staged by the Show Secretary.

Pot and pan sizes must be within 1.2cm (.5in) of sizes indicated in the Schedule. Diameter measurement is taken from the top inside rim of pot or pan. In classes involving one or more spikes, pots or pans it is necessary for each spike to have a bloom. A spike forming part of an exhibit judged to be NOT AS SCHEDULE (N.A.S.) will not be disqualified from Best in Show classes.

Judging will take into account the health, presentation and quality of cultivation of plant material exhibited.

Entries for Novices only classes are restricted to juniors, members who have not previously exhibited and those who have exhibited and not won a prize

The award of any prize is at the discretion of the judges. Any complaints concerning decisions must be made in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary before 12.30pm.

The BUNYARD VASE will be awarded for the most points in the Floral Art Division in all of the 2010 Shows and the E. B. WILLIAMSON PLATE will be awarded for the most points from all the classes in all of the 2010 Shows.

EARLY SPRING (Reticulata) SHOW

Saturday, February 6th Staging 8am—10.30am

N.B. Reasonable equivalence in numbers will be applied to clumps or stoloniferous bulbs.

Division I RETICULATA HYBRIDS AND SPECIES - BIS CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 1 RAY JEFFS TROPHY *1 entry only*

4 pots or pans, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, each with 4-6 bulbs of one variety.

Class 2 PATRICIA LINNEGAR MEMORIAL TROPHY 'Iris Garden' *1 entry only*

1 container 30cm (12in) or more across, with species and hybrids together with up to four other dwarf plants planted for effect. There must be three Iris flowers for each other flower.

Division II RETICULATA HYBRIDS One variety

Class 3 1 pot or pan 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, with 4 bulbs or less seedlings may be shown in a smaller container.

Class 4 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, with 4-6 bulbs.

Class 5 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, with 6 bulbs or more.

Class 6 1 pot or pan, 15-25cm (6-10in) diameter, with no limit to the number of bulbs.

Division III RETICULATA SPECIES One variety

Class 7 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, with 4 bulbs or less.

Class 8 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, with 4-6 bulbs.

Class 9 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, with 6 bulbs or more.

Class 10 1 pot or pan, 15-25cm (6-10in) diameter, with no limit to the number of bulbs.

Division IV NOVICE ENTRIES

Class 11 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, reticulata hybrids (any number of bulbs).

Class 12 1 pot or pan, 10-15cm (4-6in) diameter, reticulata species (any number of bulbs).

Class 13 1 pot, pan or vase of any other iris or iridaceous plant.

Division V PLANTS OTHER THAN RETICULATA IRISES

Class 14 1 pot, pan or vase of an iris (including colour forms) from any other section.

Class 15 1 pot, pan or vase of an iridaceous plant.

Division VI FLORAL ART

Class 16 An exhibit using 3 irises other than Dutch. Width up to 30cm (12in).

Natural plant material may be used and accessories will be allowed. 1 entry only

Class 17 An exhibit using 3-5 Dutch irises only. Width up to 45cm (18in).

Natural plant material other than flowers may be used. 1 entry only

Class 18 A dry exhibit using seedpods of irises. *Other dry plant material allowed.*

Width up to 38cm (15in). *1 entry only*

Division VII DECORATIVE

Class 19 Iris emblemata. Up to 10 items including, books, photographs and Memorabilia in a space of 150cm (60in) wide. Artwork, emblemata and photographic entries that are the exhibitor's own work to be stated. *1 entry only*

The OSBORNE TROPHY will be awarded to the most outstanding exhibit in Show. The CHRISTIE MILLER MEDAL TROPHY will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining most points in the Show.

LATE SPRING (Dwarf and Median) SHOW

Saturday, May 8th Staging 8am—11am

Division I MDB AND SDB HYBRID IRISES, SDB AND IB OR MDB AND IB HYBRID IRISES

Class 1 THE BIS DWARF AND MEDIAN CHAMPIONSHIP

THE MARY TAYLOR TROPHY

4 pots/pans of Bearded irises in 4 varieties from at least 2 sections (see above) and a vase of 5 stems Beardless in 1 or more varieties..

Class 2 Bearded irises raised and grown by the exhibitor. 1 pot, pan, or one spike in a vase of a MDB, SDB or IB. Arilbreds to these sizes may be shown. More than 3 entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.

Division II MDB BEARDED IRIS HYBRIDS AND NAMED CLONES

Class 3 1 pot or pan 7.5-10cm (3-4in) diameter, with one MDB.

Division III SDB HYBRID IRISES

Class 4 1 pot or pan 15-20cm (6-8in) diameter with one hybrid SDB.

Class 5 3 pots or pans 15-20cm (6-8in) diameter with one plant each in two or three hybrid SDB varieties.

Class 6 1 pot or pan over 20cm (8in) diameter with one or more hybrid SDB varieties.

Class 7 EDITH FOTHERGILL TROPHY

3 spikes of different SDB hybrids in one vase.

Class 8 6 spikes of SDB hybrids in two or more varieties, in two vases.

Division IV HYBRID BEARDED IRISES OTHER THAN MDB AND SDB IRISES

Class 9 1 spike of an IB or MTB hybrid in a vase.

Class 10 3 spikes of different IB and/or MTB hybrids in one vase.

Class 11 6 spikes of IB and/or MTB irises in two or more varieties, in two vases.

Class 12 1 spike of BB or TB hybrid in a vase.

Class 13 3 spikes of BB and/or TB irises in three varieties, in three vases.

Class 14 Any other type of hybrid Bearded Iris (eg.Arilibred) in pot, pan, or vase. More than three entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.

Class 15 Irises raised and grown by the exhibitor. 1 spike of MTB, BB, TB or Arilibred irises to these sizes, in a vase. More than three entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.

Division V OTHER HYBRID IRISES

Class 16 1 Evansia hybrid in a pot, pan or vase.

Class 17 5 spikes each of two varieties of Pacific Coast hybrids in two vases.

Class 18 3 spikes of Pacific Coast hybrids in two or three varieties in one vase.

Class 19 Any other type of Beardless hybrid iris other than bulbous in a pot, pan or vase.

Class 20 3 spikes of hybrid bulbous irises in one vase.

The GERMAN IRIS PLAQUE will be awarded to the best exhibit in Division V.

LATE SPRING (Dwarf and Median) SHOW (continued)

Division VI SPECIES IRIS AND REPUTED SPECIES IRIS

Class 21 3 different types of species iris in pots, pans or vases.

Class 22 1 Bearded (Pogon) species iris in a pot, pan or vase.

Class 23 1 Bearded species (Arilate) in a pot, pan or vase.

Class 24 1 Evansia species in a pot, pan or vase.

Class 25 1 Apogon or Bulbous species iris in a pot, pan or vase.

The MINI PECKHAM CUP will be awarded for the best species or reputed species exhibited in Classes 21-25.

Class 26 Any other Iridaceous plant in a pot, pan or vase.

More than three entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.

Division VII NOVICE ENTRIES

Class 27 1 MDB hybrid iris in a pot or pan, 7.5-10cm (3-4in) diameter.

Class 28 1 SDB hybrid iris in a pot or pan, 15-20cm (6-8in) diameter.

Class 29 1 spike of IB or MTB hybrid in a vase.

Class 30 1 spike of BB or TB hybrid in a vase.

Class 31 1 spike of a Beardless hybrid iris in a vase.

Division VIII ARTISTIC SECTION

Class 32 An exhibit including not less than five irises other than Dutch irises. *Natural plant material and accessories allowed.* **1 entry only**
Width up to 61cm (24in).

Class 33 An exhibit of irises only. *Natural plant material and accessories allowed.* **1 entry only**
Width up to 56cm (22in).

Class 34 A display of original artwork by the exhibitor relating to irises that may include drawing, painting, needlework, photography in a space up to 150cm (60in) wide. **1 entry only**

Class 35 An educational exhibit relating to irises or their history, in a space up to 200cm (78in) wide. **1 entry only**

An additional class can be added for Tall Bearded entries if there is demand – please consult the Show Secretary.
