and on Saturday morning, June 5th from 8—11am.

ENTRIES to be notified to the Show Secretary by Wednesday, June 2nd.

THE BRITISH IRIS SOCIETY SHOW RULES

British Iris Society members only may compete.

Unless otherwise stated, exhibitors are allowed up to three entries in each class.

Except in the Artistic Section, all exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor. All exhibits must be ready for judging by the close of Staging times stated above on the first day of the Show. Exhibitors unable to attend may send their entries to the hall and they will be staged by the Show Secretary.

Pot and pan sizes must be within \pm 1.2cm (.5in) of sizes indicated in the Schedule.

Diameter measurement is taken from the top inside rim of pot or pan.

In classes involving more than one spike, it is necessary for each spike to have a bloom. A spike forming part of an exhibit judged to be NOT AS SCHEDULE (N.A.S.) will not be disqualified from Best in Show classes.

Judging will take into account the quality of cultivation, health and presentation of plant material exhibited.

Entries for Novices only classes are restricted to juniors, members who have not previously exhibited and those who have exhibited and not won a prize.

The award of any prize is at the discretion of the judges.

Any complaints concerning the judges' decisions must be made in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary before 12.30pm on the first day of the Show.

Division I

Class 1

THE BRITISH IRIS SOCIETY CHAMPIONSHIP AURELIAN TROPHY

1 entry only

3 spikes of different bearded iris (species or hybrids), in separate vases, plus 3 blooms of different bearded iris, in small glass vases, plus 6 spikes of beardless iris (species or hybrids), in two varieties in 2 vases.

Division II

Class 2

HYBRID BEARDED IRISES

KATHERINE DYKES MEMORIAL BOWL

3 spikes of different bearded iris bred in Britain/Europe, in separate vases.

Class 3

PECKHAM CUP AND AIS SILVER MEDAL

3 spikes of different bearded iris bred in the USA or Canada, in separate vases.

Class 4

1 spike of a registered TB iris, in a vase.

Class 5

3 spikes of bearded iris other than TB iris, in separate vases.

Class 6

2 spikes of different selfs in separate vases.

Class 7

2 spikes of different bi-colors or bitones in separate vases.

Class 8

2 spikes of different space-age iris in separate vases.

Class 9

2 spikes of different iris from plicata, picotee, or luminata, in separate vases.

Class 10

2 spikes different historic iris, at least 30 years old, in separate vases.

Date of registration required.

Class 11

Novice exhibitors only.

2 spikes of different TBs in separate vases.

Class 12

Novice exhibitors only.

2 spikes of different iris other than TBs, in separate vases.

Class 13

RAINBOW CHALLENGE BOWL

7 blooms, in different colours in 7 small vases.

Class 14

1 bloom white and 1 bloom yellow.

Class 15

1 bloom copper/tan/brown and 1 bloom apricot/orange.

Class 16

1 bloom red and 1 bloom pink/lilac.

Class 17

1 bloom light-mid blue and 1 bloom dark blue, purple or black.

Class 18

2 blooms different iris from bi-color, plicata, picotee, luminata, blend.

Class 19

2 blooms of different historic iris. Date of registration required.

Division III BEARDLESS IRIS HYBRIDS

Class 20

3 spikes of Pacific Coast iris in 1 vase.

Class 21

6 spikes of Siberian iris in one or more varieties, in 1 vase.

Class 22

3 spikes of Sino-Siberian iris and/or Cal-Sib and/or Siberian iris in 1 vase.

Class 23

3 spikes of water loving iris and/or Ensata and/or Louisiana iris in 1 or more vases at the discretion of the exhibitor.

Class 24

3 spikes of Spuria iris in 1 vase.

Class 25

3 spikes of bulbous iris in 1 vase.

Class 26

1 spike of a beardless iris in a vase.

Class 27

Novice exhibitors only

1-5 spikes of beardless iris in 1 vase.

The HEWITT TROPHY will be awarded to the best exhibit in Division III.

Division IV **SPECIES IRIS, REPUTED SPECIES AND THEIR COLOUR FORMS**

- Class 28 5 or more different species iris from at least two different sections, in 3 vases.
- Class 29 1 species iris in a pot, pan or vase.
- Class 30 1 iridaceous plant other than iris in a pot, pan, or vase. More than 3 entries allowed if distinct species shown.
- Class 31 Novice exhibitors only
1 pot or vase of a species iris or iridaceous plant.
The RYALL MEMORIAL TROPHY will be awarded to the best exhibit in Division IV.

Division V **CULTIVARS BRED BY THE EXHIBITOR**

- Class 32 9 spikes of bearded iris in three or more varieties, in separate vases.
- Class 33 1 spike of a bearded iris in a vase. More than 3 entries allowed.
- Class 34 1-5 spikes of a beardless iris of one variety in a vase.
More than 3 entries allowed.

Division VI **ARTISTIC SECTION**

- Class 35 A modern or Japanese arrangement with irises only, other foliage may be used. Maximum width up to 60cm (24in). *1 entry only*
- Class 36 A mass exhibit. Irises must predominate. Maximum width up to 60cm (24in) *1 entry only.*
- Class 37 An educational exhibit relating to irises or their history, in a space up to 200cm (78in) wide.
- Class 38 A display of original artwork by the exhibitor relating to irises that may include drawing, painting, needlework or photography in a space up to 150cm (60in) wide..
The PHOTOGRAPHIC TROPHY will be awarded to photographic exhibits for the most accumulated points awarded in the year.

- Bi-color – two different colours
- Bi-tone – two tones of the same colour
- Blend – two or more colours combined (always one is yellow)
- Bloom – flower without a side bud
- Luminata – white or yellow style arms and hafts, pale veining on falls
- Picotee – stippled or stitched margin colour on white or yellow ground
- Self – one colour

SPECIAL TROPHIES

The **JOSEPHINE ROMNEY TOWNDROW TROPHY** will be awarded to the iris judged to be the best spike or plant in the show.
The **RANDALL TROPHY** will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains the most points in the show.

The **PHOTOGRAPHIC TROPHY** will be awarded for the most points accumulated by photographic exhibits at the 2010 shows.

The **OLIVE MURRELL TROPHY** (Novice classes only) will be awarded to the novice who gains the most points in the 2010 shows.

The **BUNYARD VASE** will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains most points in the Floral Art Division of the 2010 shows.

The **E.B. WILLIAMSON PLATE** will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains most points in all the classes of the 2010 shows.

- * The **BOB NICHOL TROPHY** will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains the most points for bearded hybrids in all the 2010 shows.
- * The **MAJORIE BRUMMITT TROPHY** will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains the most points for beardless hybrids in all the 2010 shows.
- * Classes requiring more than one type not included (Early Spring classes 1 & 2, Late Spring class 1 and Summer Show class1)
