Division I	MDB and SDB HYBRID IRISES, SDB and IB or MDB and IB HYBRID IRISES			
Class 1	THE BIS DWARF AND MEDIAN CHAMPIONSHIP THE MARY TAYLOR TROPHY			
	4 pots/pans of bearded irises in 4 varieties from at least 2 sections [see above] and a vase of 5 stems beardless irises in 1 or more varieties.			
Class 2	Bearded irises raised and grown by the exhibitor. 1 pot, pan or one spike in a vase of a MDB, SDB or IB. Arilbreds to these sizes may be shown. More than 3 entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.			
Division II	BEARDED IRIS HYBRIDS AND NAMED CLONES			
Class 3	1 pot or pan with one MDB.			
Class 4	1 pot or pan with one hybrid SDB.			
Class 5	EDITH FOTHERGILL TROPHY			
	3 spikes of different SDB hybrids in one vase.			
Class 6	Novice entries only . One MDB or SDB in a pot or pan of appropriate size, not to exceed 20cm diameter.			
Class 7	1 spike of an IB or MTB or BB or TB hybrid in a vase.			
Class 8	Irises raised and grown by the exhibitor. 1 spike of MTB, BB, TB or Arilbred irises to these sizes, in a vase. More than three entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.			
Class 9	Novice entries only. One spike of IB, MTB, BB, TB hybrid in a vase.			
Division III	OTHER HYBRID IRISES			
Class 10	1 Evansia hybrid in a pot, pan or vase.			
Class 11	3 spikes of Pacific Coast hybrids in two or three varieties in one vase.			
Class 12	Any other type of beardless hybrid other than bulbous in a pot, pan or vase.			
Class 13	3 spikes of hybrid bulbous irises in one pot, pan or vase.			
Class 14	Novice entries only. One spike of a beardless hybrid iris in a pot, pan or vase.			
The GERMAN IRIS PLAQUE will be awarded to the best exhibit in Division III.				

Division IV	SPECIES IRIS AND REPUTED SPECIES IRIS		
Class 15	1 bearded (pogon) species iris in a pot, pan or vase.		
Class 16	1 Evansia species in a pot, pan or vase.		
Class 17	1 apogon or bulbous species iris in a pot, pan or vase.		
Class 18	A species iris, species cross or iridaceous species grown from seed by the exhibitor. More than three entries allowed if different varieties exhibited.		
Class 19	An iridaceous plant other than iris, in a pot, pan or vase.		

The MINI PECKHAM CUP will be awarded for the best species or reputed species exhibited in Classes 15-19

Division V	ARTISTIC SECTION
Class 20	An exhibit including not less than five irises other than Dutch irises. Natural plant material and accessories
	allowed. Width up to 60cm
Class 21	An exhibit of irises only. Natural plant material and accessories allowed. Width up to 56cm.
Class 22	A display of original artwork by the exhibitor relating to irises that may include drawing, painting,
	needlework & photography. Width up to 56cm.
Class 23	An educational exhibit relating to irises or their history, in a space up to 200cm.

An additional class can be added for Tall Bearded entries if there is demand – please consult the Show Secretary.

THE BRITISH IRIS SOCIETY SHOW RULES

- Only British Iris Society members may compete.
- Exhibitors are permitted unlimited number of entries in each class unless otherwise stated.
- Except in the Artistic Section, all exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- All exhibits must be ready for judging by 10.00am.
- Exhibitors unable to attend may send their entries to the venue, they will be staged by the Show Secretary.
- Pot and pan sizes must be within ± 1.2cm of sizes indicated in the Schedule.
- Diameter measurement is taken from the top inside rim of pot or pan.
- Except in the Artistic Section, all vases used must be BIS vases.
- In classes involving more than one spike, it is necessary for each spike to have a bloom.
- A spike forming part of an exhibit judged to be NOT AS SCHEDULE (N.A.S.) will not be disqualified from Best in Show classes.
- Judging will take into account the quality of cultivation, health and presentation of plant material exhibited.
- Entries for Novices only classes are restricted to members who have not previously exhibited and those who have exhibited and not won a first prize.
- The award of any prize is at the discretion of the judges.
- Any complaints concerning the judges' decisions must be made in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary before 12noon on the day of the Show.
